

Panel to suggest 'good practices' in govt-run schools

Bhopal: The ten-member committee, formed to conduct inspections in the working of private schools, has also been tasked with making a note of successful practices being implemented in them. The committee will then suggest the same for implementation in government schools.

Joint director of school education department Rajeiv Tomar told TOI that the committee will conduct inspections in 65 private schools of the city by April 15 and submit the report to the Directorate of Public Instruction (DPI).

"The purpose of the committee is to check whether the schools are abiding by the CBSE by-laws, or not. It does not mean that private schools do not have good things to offer. The ten-member panel has been given the task of making a note of good practices in private schools so that we

can implement them in government schools and improve their condition," said Tomar. "It is necessary to see that private schools follow the CBSE safety guidelines, have clean



drinking water, clean toilets and do not prescribe unnecessary books to children. We have to conduct inspections in 65 schools of the city and the final report will be submitted on April 20," he said.

The task to improve the condition of government schools will be taken up as soon as the committee will be done with its inspections, added Tomar.
