MHRD tells Punjab govt to conduct audit of meal scheme

THE cash-starved Punjab gov-THE cash-starved Punjab gov-ernment has been asking the Union government time and again to contribute a larger share to run the mid-day meal programme in the state. The Union Ministry of Human Re-source Development (MHRD) though bas selved the state gov though has asked the state gov-ernment to conduct a social audit of the programme this year to improve accountability and transparency in its implementation. dured as last mancial year me school education department had failed to do so. This audit will be done in at least 20 schools in each district by in-volving the social audit units working the social auth units set up under the Mahatma Gan-dhi National Rural Employ-ment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS). A regular meet-ing of the district level committees on a monthly basis is also required to be held for proper implementation of the

programme.

According to sources, the MHRD in 2017, did not release the central grants of this program for a few months as the state government did not contribute it a charm. tribute its share. The total budget for the program is 7291 crore this year (60:40 sharing basis by Union and Punjab government). There are 13.81 lakh students in the state who are being provided mid-day meals

in 19,791 government schools. It is learnt that 42,146 cooks It is learnt that 42,146 cooks have been employed to cook these meals for the students. An honorarium of ₹1,700 per month for ten months is given to the cooks for their services. Of this ₹1,100 is paid by the state government and ₹600 by the Union government.

The cooking cost for a student of primary class is ₹4.48 per meal, while that of an upper primary class student is ₹6.71 per meal.
