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## Learn science through films at RSC

Bhopal: To encourage more children to opt for science subjects, the Regional Science Centre will hold a special screening of science-based movies as part of its monthlong Children's Day celebration. Starting next week, the science film festival aims to draw primary and secondary school students between the ages of 7 and 16.

The films screened would cover diverse topics in natural sciences, technology, climate change, sustainability and the environment. Each film will be accompanied by



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a corresponding activity that can be done with students after the screening.

The film packages are designed for a range of age groups such as 'Early Learners' for children aged 5-8 years, 'Primary School' for children aged 9-11 years, 'Secondary School' for children aged 12-16 years and the general pub-

lic aged 17 and above.

Krishnendu Choudhury, resource person of the Regional Science Centre, said, "This is the first time we have decided to include films as part of other activities planned to encourage children in different fields of science. Movies can captivate kids'attention and illustrate basic

science concepts in the real.'

Some of the films selected for screening are—'Messy Goes to Okido', 'The Marble Brothers' Great Adventure', 'The Show with the Elephant: Astronaut', 'Nanogirl and the Imaginauts', 'Earth to Future—A Future Without Plastic', 'Ralph and the Dinosaurs', 'Earth: The Nature of Our Planet', etc.

These film screenings will be accompanied by activities based on related themes and discussions where students would learn and invent practical solutions for the environmental concerns showcased in the films.
