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The objective is to empower and enhance language learning in schools and to promote language learning as a skill in Indian educational ecosystem

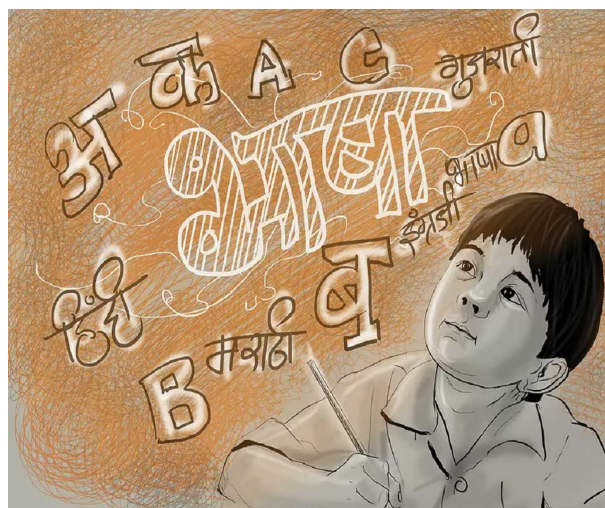
