While the program framework is around engaging students, parents, communities and motivating teachers; school's leadership is supported in prioritizing the areas of improvement and create goals. The core philosophy of the program is that if schools become engaging and happy spaces, it would result in holistic development of Students as they acquire leadership,

Broad intervention areas are:

1. **Students' empowerment**: Creation of student clubs and leadership groups to create opportunities for holistic growth; building aspirations & exposure by lecture series, participation in competitions etc.

2. **Parents & community involvement**: Encouraging structured Parent-Teacher Meetings (PTMs) and involving community to support school by bringing in resources; School Management Committee (SMC) participation etc.

3. **School leadership & teachers' engagement**: Creating a joint vision with School Leadership and motivating teachers to innovate, be more involved with students and to institutionalize new processes in schools

4. **School environment**: Supporting improvement in overall cleanliness, plantation, energizing labs/ libraries and colourful spaces for student's creative work as well as child safety processes

- To promote gender equality and girl child participation in leadership roles, both in clubs and houses.
- And to make sure each and every child is given an equal opportunity and platform to participate in various events and activities by being a member of Student Houses.

Observations and achievements:

Formations of Student Clubs and Houses have seen a welcome adaption to this initiative at the School levels, both by the Students and other Stakeholders. 211 Students clubs and 160 Students Houses have been formed at 49 schools.

Some of the key observations reported by Schools are:

- 1. Engagement of all students in Houses Each and every child is today a part of a School House thereby getting an opportunity to participate in school activities
- 2. Participation of students in school event and activities has gone up from 4.8 events per school to 8.35 events per school over the previous two years.
- 3. Clubs leaders taking the lead in organising in school competitions and activities.
- 4. Girls have taken leadership positions in Clubs and Houses and today 51% of all leadership positions are held by Girl Students.
- 5. A culture of increased participation in external events and competitions has started developing and increase in winning awards has also been noticed.
- 6. With dedicated Teachers as Club in charges, Schools are more open and willing to participate in external competitions.
- 7. In partnered Schools, visible improvement has been noticed in students' attendance i.e. from 77 % (2018-19) to 93 % (2019-20).

Students led activities through clubs and Houses – The students clubs were instrumental in organizing events and activities like - National Day celebrations, Teacher's day, Children Day, Nutrition Day, Independence Day were organized in 48 schools where 17583 students, 956 teachers, 580 parents participated.

Swachhta Hi Sewa Campaign - To celebrate the 150th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi, Bharti Foundation has planned a year-long campaign planned from Oct 1st 2018 to Oct 2nd 2019, which contains various activities such as cleanliness drives, awareness campaigns, students led 'Swachhata Committee', theme-based skills and speeches by students, theme-based drawings, poems and essays, world environment day etc. In response to the clarion call of the Hon'ble Prime Minister to join the Jan Andolan 'Swachhata Hi Seva'. 2561 students are involved as Students Ambassadors.

Other Initiatives – Students Engagement

To promote interest and proficiency in English language, District Level Spell Wizard Competition was organized with the support of District Education Departments in both the districts. The competition saw participation from 35 partner Government Schools and 02 non-partner Government Schools.

- **Students Workshops** 18 partner Government Schools actively participated in Science Exhibition cum workshop which was organized in partnership with SSA State Education Mission Authority Meghalaya (SEMAM). 735 Students and 43 teachers actively participated.
- **Student Excursion** 658 Students from 17 Schools of East & West Jaintia Hills were taken to various institutes of repute like Shillong Science Centre and Don Bosco Indigenous & Cultural Centre etc.
- **Design for Change** The power of Design Thinking allows both children and adults to transform the world into how they envision it the power to create a more compassionate, empathetic world. By spreading Design Thinking globally, Design for Change was one of the first organizations to pioneer this progressive way of thinking to schools and children. Students from Schools of Meghalaya supported under Quality Support Program participated in the DFC competition for the first time and the Students from Khatsoo Ripnar has won a position in the Top 100 entries.
- 2. Teachers & Leadership Engagement
 - School Development Plan concept shared and teachers orientation completed for 78 Teachers.
 - 62 Head Teachers and teachers trained in Reading Enhancement, Pronunciation, Phonetics and Multilevel Intelligence in the month of February 2020.
 - **TLM workshop** held for 38 teachers in the month of July 2019.

Case Story:

A CLEAN, GREEN AND HEALTHIER CAMPUS

The Lummynso UP SSA West Jaintia Hills is located at the remote areas and was facing a big trouble due to a field in-front of the school building which was totally devoid of any vegetation. The red soil in the field flies with the strong wind and covers the entire school building with dust hampering the health of the children and the teachers as well as affecting the cleanliness of the entire school.

The problem was discussed at the school level where the Mentor from the Bharti Foundation was also present. He came up with an idea to plant grass to avoid dust to fly and passed on this idea to Mrs. Niawki Samati of Lummynso UP SSA West Jaintia Hills. She readily took up this idea and with the support from Bharti Foundation collaborated with the SMC members and the parents. This collaboration managed to engage the entire community and completed the work with zero cost.

The Bharti Foundation also supported the teachers to submit the

story in the Teachers Innovation Award 2019 competition organized by Sri Aurobindo Society, New Delhi supported by HDFC Bank. Eventually she won the prize in the category of Zero Investment Innovation for Education Initiative (ZIIEI). She got felicitated by Sri Ramesh Pokhriyal, HRD Minister, Govt of India.

This award is a pride for the teacher and the village community as the entire district looks at it as an exemplary achievement as acknowledged by the SDSEO of West Jaiñtia Hills. This teacher innovation award won by Mrs. Niawki Samati in community Participation was an inspiration to many and also for the first time known in the state which resulted as an inspiration to many Schools.
